1. Examine in detail attitude of the Asian-African States in the post-UN Charter period towards traditional international law that was dubbed as having 'provincial European outlook'.
2. Discuss legal character of resolutions of the UN General Assembly. Can they be considered as one of the sources of international law?
3. Are 'non-State' entities subjects of international law? Discuss the issue of conferment of an 'observer' status to these entities under the UN system.
4. Is there a legal duty to extradite a fugitive? Discuss recent Indian practice concerning extradition of fugitives from jurisdiction of countries that do not have bilateral extradition treaty.
5. Evaluate the role and contribution of 'global conferencing technique' as a part of multilateral environmental lawmaking process to address global environmental problems.
6. Elucidate recent developments concerning legal control of international terrorism.
7. Critically examine the statement that the UN Convention on Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) cannot be interpreted "as if it were a static instrument, cast in stone somewhere around 1982".

8. Write an essay on blueprint for prohibition of threat or use of force under the UN Charter. Are there any exceptions to it?
9. Write a critical review on the proliferation of international criminal tribunals in recent years with special reference to the International Crimes Tribunal in Bangladesh.
10. Write short notes on any *two* of the following :
- (a) Khobragade Incident and Immunity for the Consular Staff
  - (b) Observer Status for India in the Arctic Council
  - (c) The Kishenganga Arbitration Final Award (Pakistan vs. India)
  - (d) Reconciling trade and environment concerns under the WTO
